I went to school at Telopea Park High from 1963 to 1965. At that time, my dad worked at the Italian Embassy as a diplomat and my family lived in Fergusson Crescent, Deakin.

After returning to Italy in August of 1965, I completed school in Rome and then went to the University of Rome, where I graduated in mechanical engineering.
